Motives for U.S. Expansion	NOTES FROM THE VIDEO
closing of the frontier motives were based on the idea that the American frontier was "closed" by 1890. No place left for the nation to expand <i>except</i> overseas.	
ECONOMIC motives include the desire to make money, to expand and control foreign trade, to create new markets for products, to acquire raw materials and cheap labor	
POLITICAL motives were based on a nation's desire to gain power, to compete with other countries, to expand territory, to gain prestige by winning colonies, and to boost national pride (nationalism) and security.	
MILITARY/STRATEGIC motives were based on the desire to acquire military bases and strategic positions to economic/political interests around the globe.	
in the belief that the white race was superior, that other cultures were "primitive" or "savage", Americans should "civilize" peoples in other parts of the world.
